BLACK TOWER RIVANER

Made in the Rheinhessen Region (Deutscher Tafelwein)

BLACK TOWER RIESLING

Made in the Pfalz Region (QbA)

ZELLER SCHWARTZ KATZ

Crisp, yet fruity, with hints of citrus & melon. (QbA) LEONARD KREUSCH Made in the Mosel Saar Ruwer Region

LIEBFRAUMILCH

Fresh and Fruity, with a soft fragrant aroma. Served chilled it is delicious as an aperitif, or with chicken, seafood, or salads. (QbA) LEONARD KREUSCH - Made in the Rheinhessen Region

LEONARD KREUSCH AUSLESE

This late harvest Auslese has rich pear & melon flavors with a crisp clean finish. (QmP) - Made in the Rheinhessen Region

In Germany there are 13 wine growing regions - Ahr, Baden, Franken, H.Bergstrasse, Mittelrhein, Mosel-Saar-Ruwer, Nahe, Pfalz, Rheinhessen, Saale-Unstrut, Sachsen, and Wurttemberg.

German Wine is Classified into Four Quality Categories, with 4 being the highest:

- 1) Deutscher Tafelwein**
translates to - German Table Wine
- 2) Landwein**
translates to - Country Wine
- 3) Qualitätswein Bestimmter Anbaugebiete (QbA)**
translates to - Quality Wine of a Specified Appellation
- 4) Qualitätswein mit Prädikat - {QmP}**
translates to - Quality Wine with Attributes.
Kabinett, Spatlese, Auslese, BA, and TBA are QmP Wines.

Some types of grapes used in German white wines are:

Riesling, Muller-Thurgau (Rivaner), Gewurztraminer, Silvaner, Kerner, Bacchus, Grauburgunder (Pinot Gris), Weissburgunder (Pinot Blanc) Scheurebe, Faberrebe, Gutedel, and Huxelrebe.
